

2017 CALL FOR ENTRIES » Unbuilt Architecture Awards

Deadline: June 2, 2017

Architects, architectural educators and architecture students throughout the world are invited to submit real or theoretical projects.

Eligibility

Unbuilt architectural designs of any project type are eligible including purely theoretical projects and unbuilt clientsponsored projects (buildings, interiors, transportation infrastructure, monuments, etc.—all project types). Projects under construction or otherwise apparently assured of construction are not eligible.

Projects that have been honored in this program in past years and work by the design professionals serving as jurors this year (or by their firms) are not eligible.

Entry Fees

The non-refundable fee for the first submission is \$100 for Massachusetts AIA members; \$175 for all others. The fee for each additional submission by the same architect or firm is \$65 for Massachusetts AIA members and \$120 for all others. (There is no limit on submissions.)

Submission checklist

Mailed entries must include:

- [1] 20" × 20" foam core presentation board (will not be returned) focusing on one project only; boards must be two-dimensional (no models)
- [2] **Project description** (see overview to the right) printed on the front of the board
- [3] Disc or flash drive that includes up to 20 images showing entire scope of the project as well as details (formatted .jpg, .tif, or .pdf, at least 2000 pixels wide and 300 dpi); a credit list; and the project description (formatted .doc or .txt). The jury does not review this disc.
- [4] Entry fee (see page 1), payable to Boston Society of Architects

Project description requirements

Describe your project in 250 words or fewer, using English. Descriptions should include responses to the following, as applicable:

- Program; your solutions to unique design challenges and special constraints
- Sustainable elements, including relevant information about regional climates and plans to measure energy data
- Accessible/universal design elements
- Urban context (links to public transportation, public facilities)
- Other information useful to the jury

International submitters

- Be sure entry form, project description, and shipping instructions are written in English.
- Payment may be made through credit card or bank check. Funds may also be wired directly to the BSA.
- If foam core is not readily available, use any stiff board that is lightweight and measures 20" x 20".
- If you are submitting internationally, be sure to allow enough time for your board to clear customs. Contact U.S. Customs and Border Protection with questions: <u>https://help.cbp.gov/</u>.
