WORLD HABITAT AWARDS COMPETITION BRIEF

The World Habitat Awards competition is open to any individual, organisation or government who has an **innovative and practical solution to housing needs and problems** from any country of the world. More than one entry can be made by the same individual or organisation.

Housing projects and approaches are sought that

- demonstrate practical, innovative and sustainable solutions to current housing issues faced by countries all around the world
- can be transferred or adapted for use as appropriate
- are already being implemented or are completed i.e. not at design stage or very early stages of development
- view the term habitat from a broad perspective and bring other benefits as well, such as energy or
 water saving, income generation, social inclusion, community and individual empowerment, health
 benefits, capacity building or education.

All entries are assessed and up to 10 projects are shortlisted by an **assessment committee**. These shortlisted projects are then evaluated by an **independent advisory group**.

Evaluation visits are made to some of the shortlisted projects before recommendations are put forward to a panel of **external judges**, including the Executive Director of the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-HABITAT).

Whilst World Habitat will not hold the copyright of any project submitted, it is understood and agreed that any project so submitted will be available for international exhibition, demonstration and publication without further permission or payment to the copyright holder. World Habitat will only accept submissions on this understanding and agreement without further permission of the copyright holder and the prize, if won, will be made to the person submitting the entry in reliance upon such representation and warranty.

World Habitat cannot be involved in any negotiations regarding financial and copyright arrangements between the two parties. Where a submission of an existing project is made by a person or persons other than the holder of the copyright, the submission of such project shall imply a representation and warranty by such person that the holder of copyright consents to such submission upon terms that it will be available for international exhibition and demonstration and publication.

Shortlisted projects will not necessarily be recognised as finalists. World Habitat reserves the right not to make an award in the event of the judges deciding that none of the submissions received achieve the standard sought or adequately fulfil the criteria.

Each year two winners receive £10,000 each and a trophy, presented at a global event.
